He emphasized on e-bird website which is a part of citizen science initiative, in which thousands of people around the world contribute their observations on bird. Dr V Rajendran, Principal, Dr NGP Arts and Science College (Autonomous) Coimbatore, Tamilnadu and Dr M Vijaya Kumar, Vice Chancellor, Yenepoya University were the Chief Guests. Addressing the gathering, Dr V Rajendran explained about nanomedicine and its uses in the field of drug delivery. The guest lecture commenced by giving the students the knowledge of Ayurveda, and the science behind how the health condition or illness is treated by understanding the physiology or the metabolism and symptoms of the person.

The students were given an understanding of the five elements the Earth or *Prithvi*; Water or *Jal* ; Fire or *Agni*; Air or *Vayu* and then Ether or *Akasha*. The challenges faced by the manufacturers were: availability of raw material with equal potency and bulk collection of the same was explained. The students were also assisted by the staff of Alva's Pharmacy to a medicinal plant garden called as "Shobavana" a garden that is growing almost 1500 species of medicinal herbs and plants. 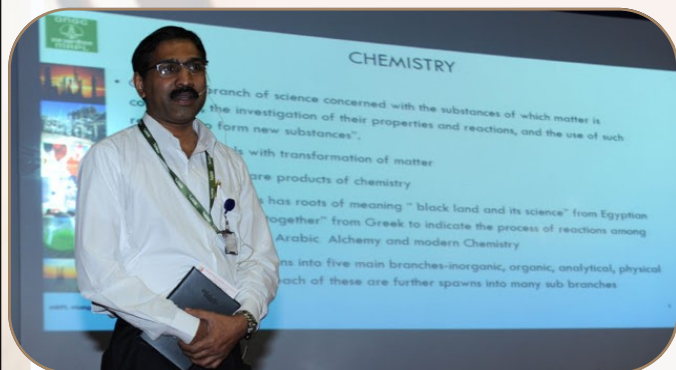
Webinar On Cyber Kill Chain

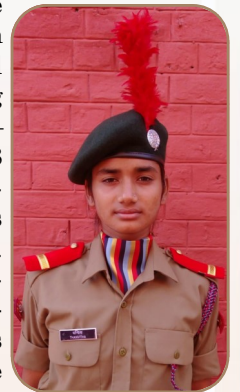

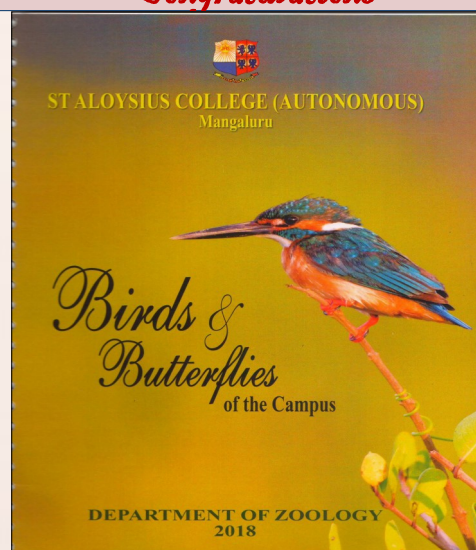

St Aloysius College ranked 3rd cleanest campus in India

College also selected under Unnat Bharath scheme

The Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD) awarded certificates in New Delhi on Monday, College principal Fr. Patrick Bhanu on Wednesday.

The rankings were based on the college's performance under the stringent parameters of the MHRD.

The parameters included cleanliness maintained in the campus, green initiatives, environmental protection measures, student toilet ratio and maintenance, canteen, biogas, clean drinking water, green audit, energy conservation, waste management and recycling.

"An inter-member team from the MHRD had visited the college to check the initiatives. The college's main forest, spread over half an acre, reflected the biodiversity of the region. Each tree on the campus has been identified under different species and named to create awareness among the student community," the principal explained.

"An eco-club technology is being used to convert waste into manure on the campus. The college got solar energy plant installed in 2015, as an alternative source of energy," Fr. Martin added.

Unnat Bharath scheme Registrar A M Narayan said the college had been selected by the MHRD under the Unnat Bharath scheme. "The MHRD launched the scheme with an aim to connect higher education institutions with local communities to address the issue of development challenges through appropriate technology," he explained.

"Accordingly, five village take up development work in the villages."

"One-ruppee campaign" "such outreach activities will be funded from the 'One-ruppee campaign' launched by the college, where students, staff, parents, alumni and faculty of the college will donate Rs 1 every day for an entire academic year. The students have already undertaken awareness programmes on environment conservation and mother and child health care in the village," she informed.

"The college intends to create awareness on ill-effects of drug abuse to the target audience comprising youth in the village," said Shrotha.

"We will also focus on higher education," she said and development programme, they had tied up with Dakshin Kannada Zilla Panchayat to install incinerators in post-graduate high schools in the village for scientific disposal of sanitary napkins.

"The college will also conduct soft skill training programmes for villagers," Shrotha said.
